#### **HEPATITIS B VACCINATION IN NEWBORNS**

## **NEWBORN USE ONLY**

#### 1 AIM

To safely administer hepatitis B vaccine.

#### 2. PATIENT

All newborns

## 3. STAFF

Nursing and midwifery staff Medical staff

## 4. EQUIPMENT

Hepatitis B vaccine 0.5 mL H-B-Vax-II is used for doses administered at birth. Infanrix Hexa is used for doses administered at 2, 4 and 6 months of age.

# **5. CLINICAL PRACTICE**

# INFORMED CONSENT SHOULD BE OBTAINED FROM PARENTS PRIOR TO ADMINISTRATION!

THIS MEDICATION CAN BE ADMINISTERED BY A STANDING ORDER. STANDING ORDERS MUST BE SIGNED BY THE Medical Officer (MO) WITHIN 24 HOURS.

Infants ≥ 28 weeks gestation administer 0.5 mL IM as a single dose in the anterolateral aspect of the thigh as soon as possible after birth. The first dose must be given within 7 days.

A total of four doses should be administered at either: Birth, 2 months, 4 months and 6 months OR Birth, 2 months, 4 months and 12 months

Babies born at < 32 weeks gestation or with a birth weight < 2000 g may require an additional dose at 12 months of age.

Infants < 28 weeks gestation administer hepatitis B vaccines as per neonatologist.

## 7. EDUCATIONAL NOTES

#### Contraindications:

Anaphylaxis following a previous dose of hepatitis B vaccine Anaphylaxis following any component of the vaccine.

## Adverse events:

Swelling tenderness. Fever can occur in 0.6-3.7% of cases.

#### Storage

Store between 2–8°C. Storage above or below the recommended temperature may decrease potency.
