



One way to show your support for the LGBTIQ+ community is to insert your pronoun in the signature block in your email. Using your pronoun in an email indicates your acknowledgement of gender diversity. An example is shown below:

Support Services for LGBTIQ++ patients

QLife provides a free Australia-wide anonymous LGBTIQ++ peer support and referral service for people wanting to talk about a range of issues including sexuality, identity, gender, bodies, feelings, or relationships. QLife is available for people who identify as LGBTIQ++, their friends and families, and health professionals in Australia. Their services are free and available either via telephone or via webchat. Two simple ways to provide gender-appropriate care

- 1. Introduce yourself using your own pronouns (this will show it is safe for the person to tell you theirs!)
- 2. Do not assume you know someone's pronoun ask them in private


WHAT DO THE DIFFERENT FLAGS REPRESENT?

Rainbow Pride Flag



The original rainbow pride flag was designed by Gilbert Baker in 1978. The colours of the rainbow represent a symbol of hope.

Transgender Flag



Philadelphia's People of Colour Inclusive Flag



Created in 2017, this version adds black and brown to the rainbow flag to represent the unique challenges faced by Black and brown people in the LGBTIQ+ community.

'Progress' Pride Flag



Designed by Daniel Quasar, this flag adds the colours and stripes from Philadelphia's pride flag (black and brown) and the ones of the transgender pride flag (pink, blue, and white) to the original pride flag. To read more about the flags, please click <u>here</u> to visit the website.
