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1 Foreword

The Public Health Unit is responsible for monitoring, preventing and otherwise minimising public health risks in the community. These risks might be infectious diseases acquired from other people, from animate vectors, such as mosquitoes, or from sources in the built environment, legionellosis being a good example. Other risks might be caused by exposure to toxic chemicals, whether present in tobacco smoke, or a result of contamination of the air, soil or water by industrial processes.

To undertake this work, the Public Health Unit comprises a multidisciplinary professional team of registered nurses and surveillance officers, medical personnel, environmental health officers and epidemiologists, supported by able administrative staff. Staff work closely within the District with population health staff and clinicians in all hospitals and in the community, with Health Protection NSW and with other agencies to respond to and minimise public health risks.

In 2023 we developed and implemented a PHU Research Strategy, which included aims to support staff to enhance their research knowledge, skills and confidence; build individual and team capacity to undertake research; and increase the number of staff involved in research. We can see the Strategy is already bearing fruit with three PHU staff becoming published authors for the first time in 2023. Congratulations to Reannon Johnson, Thea Briggen Tiqui and Courtney McGregor on their successful first research endeavours!

This Research Report showcases research published or accepted for publication or presentation over the last year, and also summarises some new projects – in infectious diseases, environmental health risks and regulation including tobacco control, and the impact of COVID-19, and we hope this work will have an impact on future public health.
