New Directions - Information for Women

How does New Directions work?

New Directions is a program that enables Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander women to be cared for by the same midwife with the support of an Aboriginal Health worker. Care is provided throughout pregnancy and up to 14 days after the birth of the baby.

The provision of care aims to provide families with continuity and encourages the development of individualised care to improve outcomes for mothers and babies.

For most women an allocated midwife will be able to provide the majority of the antenatal care. If the need for medical consultation or referral arises, the NEW DIRECTIONS midwife is supported by the Obstetric Teams at Sutherland Hospital or St George Hospital.

Availability of your Midwife

You will be given the mobile phone number of your midwife.

This number can be called or texted between Mon-Fri 8:00 am to 4.30pm for

- Appointment Changes
- Informing your midwife that you have an Ultrasound or blood test
- NON URGENT issues relating to yourself and/or your baby after birth

This could include, but is not limited to:

- Vaginal bleeding
- A change in your baby's/babies' movements
- Vomiting/diarrhoea for more than 24hrs
- Bad headaches, vision problems
- Contractions less than 5 mins apart
- Fall
- Motor vehicle accident
- Painful contractions before 37 weeks
- If you think your waters are broken
- Any other URGENT questions or concerns you may have

YARNING CIRCLE

This is a free program that is a combination of antenatal appointments, information and A LOT of connecting! Each week we will have an information topic to discuss with guest speakers

AFTER BABY IS BORN

Your midwife will discuss with you the benefits of going home early. Alternatively, transfer to the postnatal ward will be arranged after the birth of your baby and the hospital postnatal staff will care for you there.

Once discharged from hospital, your New Directions Midwife will arrange your ongoing care through a combination of phone calls and home visits as required. The number of visits you receive is based on your individual needs.

THE NEXT STEP

When you are discharged from New Directions, the staff from Narrangy-Booris, will support you to care for your baby until they are 5 years old.
